Purposes of processing	The ECB will process your personal data for the purposes of: • Contacting you about future market research surveys • Reporting of figures and trends in the interest of cricket participation (including equality, inclusion and diversity information); • Fulfilling the award of prizes from the prize draw (where applicable) • Quality and improvement monitoring • Academic research, analysis and publication
Who we will disclose your personal data to	No individual personal data is disclosed although our service provider that helps us with the survey will receive your response, analyse it and provide us with aggregated findings. If you choose to enter the prize draw, our service provider will provide your email address to us to enable us to administer the draw and notify winners. If you consent to allow your responses to be used for academic research, analysis and publication, we may share aggregated non-identifiable data with our research partners.
Legal basis for processing your personal data	The legal basis for the collection and processing of your personal data is: • equality and inclusion: that you have given your explicit consent or that it is in your vital interests. • prize draw administration. to fulfil the contractual requirements of the prize draw. • academic research, analysis and publication: that you have given your explicit consent. • in all other cases: that it is necessary for our legitimate interests which are to help regulate the sport of cricket, develop and implement cricket initiatives and to ensure, that the reputation of cricket is preserved, this does not prejudice or harm your rights and freedoms.
Your right to withdraw consent	Where you have given your consent to any processing of personal data, you have the right to withdraw that consent at any time. If you do, it will not affect the lawfulness of any processing for which we had consent prior to your withdrawing it.
Location of your personal data	We will keep your personal data within the UK or the European Economic Area.
How long we will keep your personal data for	We will normally keep your data for 2 years from your last engagement with us, after this period, your personal data will be securely deleted. If you have agreed to be involved in future cricket research and surveys, your data will be kept for as long as you choose to remain part of the survey pool. You can change your mind about being involved in market research and surveys at any time.
Your rights in respect of your personal data	You have the right of access to your personal data and, in some cases, to require us to restrict, erase or rectify it or to object to our processing it, and the right of data portability.
